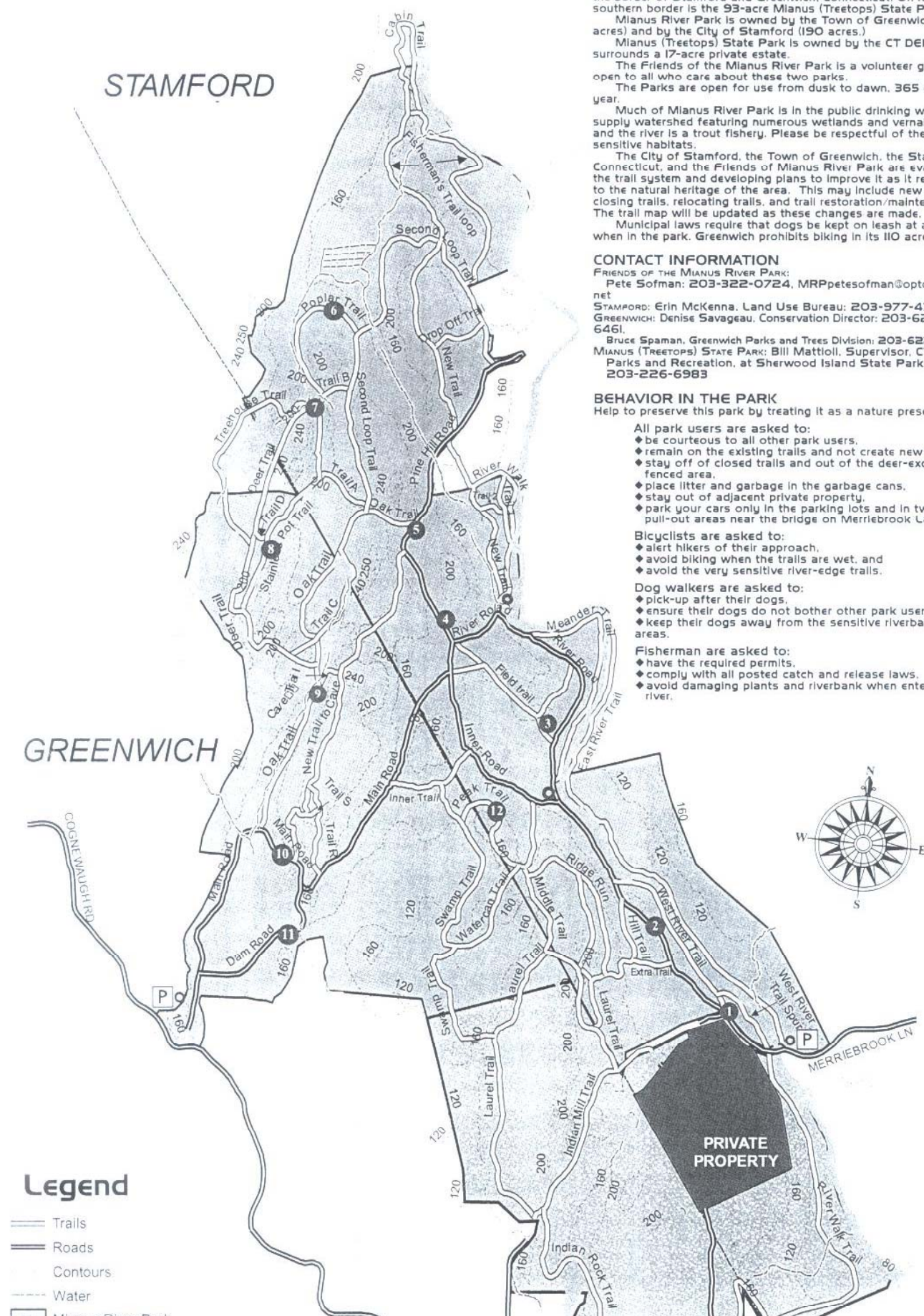
# Mianus River Park

Mianus River Park is a 300-acre forested open space, straddling the border of Stamford and Greenwich, Connecticut. On its southern border is the 93-acre Mianus (Treetops) State Park.

Mianus River Park is owned by the Town of Greenwich (110 acres) and by the City of Stamford (190 acres.)  
 Mianus (Treetops) State Park is owned by the CT DEP, and surrounds a 17-acre private estate.

The Friends of the Mianus River Park is a volunteer group open to all who care about these two parks.  
 The Parks are open for use from dusk to dawn, 365 days a year.

Much of Mianus River Park is in the public drinking water supply watershed featuring numerous wetlands and vernal pools, and the river is a trout fishery. Please be respectful of these sensitive habitats.

The City of Stamford, the Town of Greenwich, the State of Connecticut, and the Friends of Mianus River Park are evaluating the trail system and developing plans to improve it as it relates to the natural heritage of the area. This may include new trails, closing trails, relocating trails, and trail restoration/maintenance. The trail map will be updated as these changes are made.

Municipal laws require that dogs be kept on leash at all times when in the park. Greenwich prohibits biking in its 110 acres.

### BEHAVIOR IN THE PARK

Help to preserve this park by treating it as a nature preserve.

- All park users are asked to:
- ◆ be courteous to all other park users.
  - ◆ remain on the existing trails and not create new trails.
  - ◆ stay off of closed trails and out of the deer-exclusion fenced area.
  - ◆ place litter and garbage in the garbage cans.
  - ◆ stay out of adjacent private property.
  - ◆ park your cars only in the parking lots and in two pull-out areas near the bridge on Merriebrook Lane.

- Bicyclists are asked to:
- ◆ alert hikers of their approach.
  - ◆ avoid biking when the trails are wet, and
  - ◆ avoid the very sensitive river-edge trails.

- Dog walkers are asked to:
- ◆ pick-up after their dogs.
  - ◆ ensure their dogs do not bother other park users.
  - ◆ keep their dogs away from the sensitive riverbank areas.

- Fisherman are asked to:
- ◆ have the required permits.
  - ◆ comply with all posted catch and release laws.
  - ◆ avoid damaging plants and riverbank when entering the river.
